## GOLD COAST MEMORIES

### The Duryea Starch Works



Glen Head got its name in 1865 when it became the last stop - or "head of the rails" - of the LIRR's Glen Cove Branch. Before the expansion of the railroad brought with it a steady stream of early suburbanites, manufacturing jobs associated with the Industrial Revolution was what attracted people to the area. Clay mining, boat-building, and a brick factory were among the industries active in the area known as Cedar Swamp.

Many local residents were employed by the Duryea Corn Starch Company; its main plant opened on the south side of Glen Cove Creek in the mid-19th century. By the end of the Civil War, the factory was the largest producer of starch in the world, covered thirty acres and employed more than 700 workers. A fire destroyed much of it in 1898; and, after a second fire in 1906, it closed.
