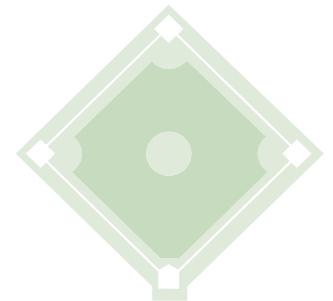


Go Out to the Ballgame with the Gold Coast Public Library!

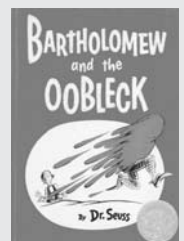

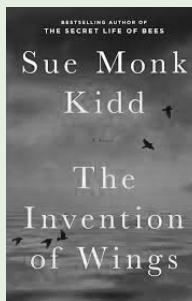
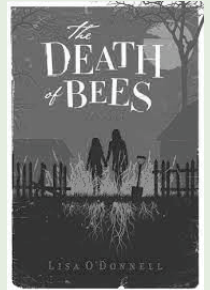

Red Headed Woman (1932)

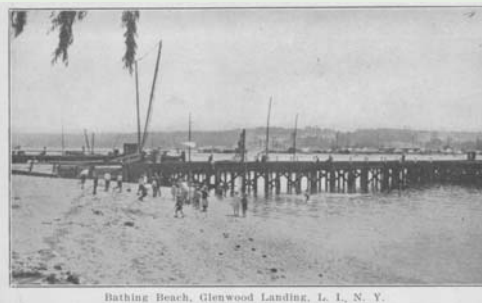
August 29th
