## GOLD COAST MEMORIES

### America's First Women's Golf Course



The Glen Head Country Club opened in 1947 on the site of what had been the first golf course in the United States to be developed and financed entirely by women. The Women's National Golf & Tennis Club was formed in the 1920s when members of the Creek Club in Locust Valley decided to disallow women golfers.

A group of local women purchased 176 acres in Glen Head, enough land for twenty-two tennis courts in addition to an 18-hole golf course.

The course was developed by East Islip-born Marion Hollins (1892-1944, pictured at right with Bobby Jones), an amateur golfer and pioneer in the field of golf course development. She won the 1921 U.S. Women's Amateur, one of her many amateur wins, and was captain of the first U.S. Curtis Cup team in 1932. She also helped develop two additional world-class golf courses in California: Cypress Point and Pasatiempo.

The Women's National survived as an all-female club for eighteen years. Then the after-effects of the long depression, foreclosure of the club, and changing attitudes resulted in women being allowed to join The Creek Club once again.
